

FORTY-DAY BIBLE READINGS FOR LENT *

Preamble

In the Reformed sector of the Christian church we have, historically, had mixed feelings and practices concerning the Christian calendar. Our forefathers took seriously what they called the regulative principle of worship. According to this principle, the church only has the right to implement in the essence of public worship that which is specifically commanded and regulated by God in his Word. On this understanding, Lent is no more holy (set apart by God) than is Christmas or Easter. It cannot then be mandated.

That said, amid the opposing forces of the secularism and multi-religiosity of our world today, what is not holy, may, in a biblically-Reformed way, become helpful, both to ourselves as Christians and as efforts in reaching the nonChristian world. While, then, the Reformed do not advocate giving up pleasures for Lent (since neither Easter nor the forty-day preparation are required by Scripture), we may offer a Bible reading schedule to aid those keen to learn more of the life, death, and resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. After all, no one loses out spiritually by filling their minds with the written and living word of God. Indeed, Jesus prayed to his Father that he would sanctify his disciples by his Word, for his Word is truth (Jn. 17:17).

It is in this light that I offer the following reading schedule. May each of us find it spiritually profitable. It consists of select readings from the four Gospels, covering the period from Jesus' setting of his face to go to Jerusalem (Lk. 9:51) until the resurrection (as recorded by the four Gospels). In following the schedule, focus not on Lent but on the majestic person and work of the Lord Jesus. May God richly bless to us our meditation on his Word.
